Curbside Recycling is coming to Taylorville!

We are very pleased to announce this exciting new program exclusively for Taylorville residents.

With the pressure on our landfill, Salt Lake County Sanitation Division leaders have believed the day would come when it could economically provide a curbside recycling program.

Finally, that day has come. Beginning in March 2003, Salt Lake County Sanitation will begin a curbside recycling pilot program in Taylorville to recycle paper, cardboard, aluminum and tin cans (no glass).

The benefits of this program will include energy saving, extending the life of the landfill, utilizing reusable materials and a general benefit to the overall environment.

We encourage all residents to consider voluntarily signing up for this \$3.00 per month service. Each 95-gallon recycling container will be picked up every other week on the same day as your normal curbside trash collection.

OF CURBSIDE RECYCLING

Salt Lake County Sanitation is pleased to announce a curbside recycling pilot program in Taylorsville. The voluntary program will begin in March 2003; we encourage all Taylorsville residents to participate. In order to join in the fulfillment of recycling the homeowner will need to sign and notarize a recycling agreement and make a one-year commitment. The cost is \$3.00 per month with the initial 12-month period payable in advance. A 95-gallon automated container will be provided; it will be emptied every other week on your normal trash collection day.

Your participation will not only help utilize reusable materials but it will also aid the energy conservation effort and extend the life of the landfill.

With this new program you will now be able to recycle paper, cardboard, plastics, aluminum and tin cans by simply placing them in the designated container. Glass will not be permitted in this container. Please make sure all items are completely empty.

Items you CAN recycle in Curbside Recycling Program

- Newspaper and Newspaper Inserts. Newspaper and advertising supplements that are included with the newspaper will be accepted.
 - Corrugated Cardboard. Corrugated cardboard has a wavy layer between two thinner layers. You can also include brown paper bags. *Please do not include pizza boxes or other boxes that have food contamination on them.* Break down the boxes to fit inside the container.
 - Paperboard. You can also recycle paperboard from cereal boxes, paper towel and toilet paper tubes, shoe boxes, detergent boxes, etc.
 - Magazines and Phone Books.
 - Aluminum Cans. Aluminum beverage cans are happily accepted; however, *we do not accept aluminum foil*.
 - Tin Cans. Only food or beverage cans will be accepted. Please remove labels and rinse cans before placing them in you bin. *No aerosol cans*.
 - All Plastics. You can recycle any plastic item with the number 1 – 7 recycling symbol on the container including plastic grocery bags. Remove and discard any lids from bottles.
 - Plastic Coated Milk and Juice Cartons. Rinsed dairy and juice cartons with “Gable-Top” in half-gallon, quart and pint sizes will also be accepted.
 - Paper. You can recycle junk mail, office paper and notebook paper.

Items you CANNOT recycle in Curbside Recycling Program

Please *DO NOT* put the following items in your recycling container:

- Glass
- Yard Waste
- Clothing
- Small Appliances
- Napkins, Paper Towels, Toilet Paper
- Food and Food Wrappings
