

**Taylorsville Community Council Meeting**  
**October 24, 2013, 7 p.m., Majestic Oaks Clubhouse**

Jerry Milne conducted the meeting.

Jerry gave a report from the October 16 Taylorsville Council Meeting as follows:

1. Leaf recycling is available at Vista Park and Valley Regional Park
2. Council accepted a redevelopment area and buy in to the Family Center by Taylorsville City to assist owners and businesses to work together with the city to "spruce up the place".
3. A request for a change of allowable home daycare children be upped from 10 to 16 with one adult was turned down as a decision on this matter could change it for other home businesses and the traffic issues caused by the influx of customers.
4. Signs on the roads are big and bold, but also ugly, but used to try and attract customers off the street and into their businesses.
5. 4500 South sidewalk was approved between 500 West going west on the north side of the street and connecting to the tunnel under 4500 South so pedestrians can cross 4500 South safely.
6. The Center Point Community Development representatives will hold a public hearing in the future.

Jerry Milne introduced Ryan Perry, representing the Unified Fire Service Area.

Mr. Perry had a Board Report he shared with attendees and explained the UFSA is a funding unit for the fire department buildings/equipment. He explained the structure of the board and district and UFA. If we vote to join the UFSA, Station 117 on Redwood Road across from the Community College would be demolished and a new station built at approximately 5200 South. This is an even more central location to the center of Taylorsville. It would increase our fire squads available from 2 to 3 and improve the response time to our area.

Several questions were discussed and explained.

The summary of his presentation was that Taylorsville will get service in Taylorsville for every dollar collected from residents in our city. By joining, we will pay a little more, but we will have faster and better service.
