

Richard Paul Evans is the #1 bestselling author of *The Christmas Box*. Each of his fourteen novels has appeared on the New York Times bestseller list; with more than 14 million copies of his books in print worldwide. His books have been translated into more than 22 languages, and several have been international bestsellers. Evans is the winner of the 1998 American Mothers Book Award and two first-place Storytelling World Awards for his children's books. Four of his books have been produced as television movies. Evans received the Washington Times Humanitarian of the Century Award and the Volunteers of America National Empathy Award for his work helping abused children.

In 1996, Evans founded *The Christmas Box House International*, an organization devoted to providing services for thousands of abused and neglected children and youth each year, having helped over 20,000 to date. Evans lives in Salt Lake City, Utah, with his wife, Keri, and their five children.
