

Taylorville Code Enforcement

Have you ever had a neighbor or someone in your neighborhood that doesn't maintain their yard or that has more stuff than room to store it? These may be violations of City Ordinances. Potential ordinance violations are brought to the attention of the City in various ways: field observations by City employees, reports from community service providers, and you, our concerned resident.



Some of the more common ordinance violations include accumulation of junk or garbage, parking vehicles on landscaping (including gravel), improperly stored motor vehicles or parts, and excessive weeds.



In order for the City to investigate a complaint or potential ordinance violation the City needs two critical pieces of information: the exact address of the issue and a description of what the issue is. Once this information is gathered a Code Enforcement Officer will then investigate for any and all code violations. The intent and purpose of code enforcement is to educate not to punish. A courtesy notice will be sent to the property owner.
