

# City of Taylorsville Code Enforcement

The City of Taylorsville strives to maintain a healthy community and has adopted ordinances to assist in maintaining the health and safety of its residents. Adherence to the ordinances is necessary to promote a safe, healthy and neighborly community. Different violations are enforced by the change in seasons.



The following are some of the most frequently committed violations:

- (1) **Junk, trash and debris.** This includes, but is not limited to, vehicle parts, used lumber, discarded furniture, and items that should normally be stored inside the residence of an accessory building at the rear of the property.
- (2) **Inoperable motor vehicles.** Vehicles which are not currently registered in this state or another or are in a state of disrepair.
- (3) **Overgrown conditions.** Lawn and/or weeds in excess of six inches on any area of the property. All landscaping is required to be maintained in good condition.
- (4) **Weeds.** Weeds must not reach a height of more than 6 inches on any area of the property.
- (5) **Dead Vegetation.** All dead tree branches, including those which may still be attached to a tree, must be removed from the property. Any vegetation which impairs pedestrian traffic on a City sidewalk must be trimmed back to the edge of the sidewalk.
- (6) **Illegal signs.** Any sign on any utility pole is in violation and will be removed. No sign may be placed in or on a City right-of-way. All other signs erected on private property require a permit and must be approved before being installed, including A-frame signs, pedestal signs and banner signs.
- (7) **Parking on landscaping.** No vehicle may be parked on any area of the property which is required to be landscaped. The only suitable parking surfaces are concrete products and asphalt, and on rare occasions gravel when approved by the City.
