Youth Ambassadors are residents of Taylorsville who are chosen each September and they serve for a period of one year. Each ambassador will be awarded a \$750 scholarship to be used at any institution of higher learning which they choose.

In addition to attending ribbon cuttings, various civic events, volunteering at Taylorsville Dayzz, and participating in parades during the summer, Taylorsville Youth Ambassadors will work on their individual service projects.

Kristen will organize a project to provide fleece blankets to patients at Primary Children's Hospital. For her project, Jordan will do a fundraiser for Operation Smile. Harry plans to establish an e-mail or help desk to take calls from individuals needing assistance with chores such as yard work. Maria has chosen to organize a 5K Run at the Jordan River parkway, with proceeds to be donated towards parkway trail cleanup. Shantel will organize activities for kids of elementary and junior high ages with special needs or going through a difficult time. Jacob will volunteer two days a week, helping a teacher at Plymouth Elementary.
