Street names often have little to do with the actual characteristics of the street location. Taylorville's Quailstone Drive is an exception. It actually turns out to be a great place for quail. A covey of quail seems as common as a cluster of kids scurrying across curbs and sidewalks - which implies Quailstone Drive is also a fine place for humans.

Dave Bowen, 2140 West Quailstone Drive (4805 South), knew that when he and his family moved to Quailstone about four years ago. The street was under snow at the time, but he was assured of the neighbor's reputation for excellent care and grooming of their property. Dave, his wife Mandy and children Alex and Gracie have only magnified that status. They are this month's winners of the Best of Taylorville award, presented by the Taylorville Leisure Activities Recreation and Parks Committee to residents and businesses for exceptional care of their property. It's the second time residents of Quailstone have been so recognized.

Recently, Dave installed a colored concrete mow strip which separates his lush, finely tuned lawn from flower beds, now packed with vibrant combinations of petunias, geraniums, ornamental grasses and shrubs. A strategically located fountain and hanging potted plants give the entrance to the residence an air of tranquility.

Dave says it's satisfying to be part of a neigh-



borhood that takes pride in how it presents itself to the rest of the community, quail and all.

For their efforts the Bowens will be recognized by the Taylorville City Council; they will receive a beautiful plaque donated by Crown Trophy and a basket of goodies from Great Harvest Bakery, both supportive Taylorville businesses
