Jolene Dearden, gave a warm welcome to members of the committee and acknowledged Kristie Overson from the City Council, and Rhetta Mciff, who is from the city offices and will act as liaison to the committee. Members of the committee introduced themselves.

A map of the 2-A Community Council area was given to members. Jolene also past out a copy of next years schedule of meetings, as well as, a copy of suggestions for topics of discussion for the coming year. She asked that members put in the order of their preference and return to her.

A brief overview of the executive committee was given by Rhetta Mciff. She reported that the chair should be a conduit of information which is passed to the city administration regarding the needs of the community. The vice-chair will support the chair and take charge of meetings when the chair is unable to attend. The secretary takes minutes of meetings which are given to Rhetta to put on the city web site and will be discussed and used as information to the city from the committee.

Jolene encouraged members to see if they could think of other people who might be interested in being on the committee. We have a good mix of community representation but could use more. She will give members a roster next month.

Rhetta Mciff suggested that the committee add to the topics for discussion “Community Projects”. Her position with the city is to help find solutions on issues confronting business and residence in the community. She reported that people call with complaints and she would like to find a common ground to help meet each others needs and find solutions to the problems in the city.

Rhetta also reported that the city is looking at doing a trail system through the city to connect the parks and businesses. She outlined the proposed route of the trail. It should go through the middle of the city, and there should be some federal funding as well.

Jolene discussed the challenges of the traffic lights on 5400 south. It is a state road as well as 4700 south, Redwood Road, and Bangerter Highway. Ryan Swensen briefly discussed the new access to Walmart.

Kristie Overson reported that a meeting is being organized where the police and fire chiefs will come to give information and discuss issues of concern. The possible date for this is Thursday, January 2, 2014. Taylorsville residents and interested citizens are invited to attend.

Terri Porter, Assistant Manager of Fresh Market, reported that they have a concern with all the pan handling, drug deals, break-ins, shoplifting and cars stolen at their store.

Pan handling was discussed and it was suggested that the city dispatch be contacted at 801-743-7000. It was also suggested that the committee have a detective come to our meeting to discuss these issues.
