

Taylorsville Code Enforcement

The purpose of code enforcement is to protect the health and safety of the public, to foster neighborhood stability, to preserve the appearance, character and beauty of neighborhoods, to encourage community pride, to preserve the value of property, and to protect the general welfare of the City and its citizens, businesses, and visitors.

The City of Taylorsville has established local laws, called City Codes, which are designed to promote safe and attractive residential neighborhoods and commercial districts. While the majority of residents obey City ordinances, there are instances where property owners violate one or more City Codes. Violations are often committed because the property owner simply does not know that a violation of City Code is occurring on their property. Because of this, the first goal of ordinance enforcement is to educate property owners, residents, and business owners regarding codes that regulate private property, usually through the use of a "courtesy notice" sent through the mail service.
