


Taylorsville Code Enforcement



Over the course of the last several years, the City of Taylorsville has received numerous phone calls regarding the number of dogs or cats that are allowed on a property. The general answer to that inquiry is two adults of each species. If a resident desires to have more animals than that, there is a Conditional Use Permit process specific to animals that may allow this to happen.

There are two general types of applications that the City of Taylorsville regularly processes with regard to animals, the first is an Animal Hobby Permit, and the second is an Animal Fancier Permit. Both permit types must receive approval from the Planning Commission at a public hearing. The difference between these two permits is explained below.

Fancier Permit: This permit allows the owner to have more than two dogs or cats in a residential area, provided that each animal is registered with a national registry, eligible for licensing by West Valley City Animal Services, and approval is granted by the Director of West Valley City Animal Services. Adequate areas for shelter and confinement must be verified.

Hobby Permit: This permit allows pet owners to keep more than two dogs or cats in a residential area, provided that each animal is rendered sterile, individually licensed and approval is granted by the Director of West Valley City Animal Services. Adequate areas for shelter and confinement must be verified.
