We will host the 2nd Annual Veterans Day Parade on Friday, November 11, 2011 at 11:00 a.m. We will have the privilege to honor those who have served this country during times of war and conflict in many parts of the world and here at home. After the parade, we will also be hosting our third annual Veterans Day Celebration at the City of Taylorville, 2600 W. Taylorville Blvd. on Friday, November 11, 2011 at 12:15 p.m.

The parade will start at 11:00 a.m. at 4900 South 2700 West and will proceed south on 2700 West from the Taylorville Library, ending at City Hall. This year we will have Co-Grand Marshals in the parade: SFC Daniel Nehring (recently returned Iraq War Vet) and the family of IT1 (EXW/IDW/FPJ) Jared Day (KIA Afghanistan, 8-6-11).

Our program includes Governor Gary Herbert as Key Note Speaker, flag raising ceremony, flag folding ceremony, recognition of Taylorville students in the poster and essay contests, patriotic musical numbers, military helicopter fly-over, memorabilia from World War II, Vietnam, Iraq, and Afghanistan Wars, and the unveiling of the first of nine sculptures of the future Veterans Memorial. The unveiling of the first sculpture of the Veterans Memorial signifies our successful efforts to construct the Memorial. The Veterans Memorial in Taylorville will commemorate the sacrifices and perseverance during times of war and peace and the dedication to a cause we all believe in. It will stand as a lasting reminder of the Veterans who have done their part to protect American freedom values.


