This month's historic photos show Frame's Market, now Bell's Deli, located at 1217 West 4800 South.



When World War II came to an end, Elmer Tripp purchased a barracks building from old Camp Kearns. He moved it to 1217 West 4800 South in Taylorsville with the intention of using it as an auto repair shop. He did this for a number of years until his father Willard Tripp decided to move his "convenience" store to that same location. Willard and his wife ran the grocery store until it was purchased by Dick and Dolly Frame in the early 1950's, when it was known as Frame's Market.

The next owner of the grocery store was Richard Saddler. When Harold and Faye Ross became the new owners, it was given the name of Ross's Market. One more name change came about when it was purchased by the Bell Family, to become Bell's Deli.

Today, in 2010, it continues as a sandwich shop (still called Bell's Deli), owned and operated by Phyllis Kim, who makes the claim of serving the best hamburger in Utah!
