This month's exciting photo is of the Alexander David Frame Home, which was located at 1399 West 4800 South, in Taylorsville, Utah. His wife Minerva was a local piano teacher, who taught many Taylorsville residents in this home. There was a white swing on the premises, that held many tender memories for those students.

The home was torn down to make the land available to build the new Taylorsville Stake Center. The land was purchased from the Frame family for \$39,500, and gave access to two acres which also were used for recreational facilities. The building was completed in 1964. The Taylorsville Stake Center is also occupied by Taylorsville 1st Ward, Taylorsgrove Ward, and Taylorsville Park Ward.
