**Taylorsville Historic Preservation Committee features monthly articles to spark interest in the heritage of our community.**



This month's memorable historic photo is of the Plymouth School which was both an elementary and junior high school. Its location was on the northeast corner of 4800 South and Redwood Road. It was dedicated in 1906 after a community outbreak of smallpox delayed the opening day of school. It was also known as the 38th District School. It withstood the test of time, having seen three generations of families walk through its doors. The community said "Goodbye" to the old Plymouth School in 1986.

Now located on that same corner is the Circle K (formerly Conoco), one of the busiest gas stations in the City of Taylorsville. Notice that this photo shows gas at \$2.65 earlier in the year!
