

Mayor's Message

In my proposed budget this year, I have included the city joining the Unified Police Department for all of our police services. Many people have asked questions regarding this. Here are some of the reasons we should consider joining UPD:

1. It would save the city more than half a million dollars per year.
2. UPD provides pooled services such as SWAT, canine, evidence, dispatch, records, and administrative services. These costs can be shared amongst a large group, thereby creating "economies of scale" and providing a better quality service.
3. Taylorsville currently has a relatively small police department where our officers don't have some of the opportunities for growth and advancement like they would in a large department. This may cause some officers to look outside our department.

Joining UPD gives our officers opportunities for career and personal growth. It also gives them the chance to become better officers in speciality areas.

4. Having multiple agencies in the county creates communication problems and "territorial" issues and duplication of services. These issues can impede efficient public safety.

Taylorsville is already a member of UPD. We currently contract for some of the services listed above. The UPD model gives cities the advantage of maintaining control over law enforcement services while enjoying the benefits of increased service for lower cost. The decision to put UPD in the budget has nothing to do with the quality of our police officers. We have some of the best in the county. We would keep our same officers and residents would see very little change in day to day operations.

The City Council will make the final decision on whether or not to join UPD in June.



Jensen Phillips 66 to M&M Service Station

This month's highlight features **Jensen Phillips 66** Service Station located at 4804 South Redwood Rd. The photo on the left was taken around 1949, and displayed the famous Phillips 66 logo, that was orange and brown. This prominent service station was built by Ora W. Jensen, who also owned the Jensen Oil Company directly behind the station. In 1959, Phillips 66 changed their colors to Red and White. During that time, Vaughan Keller leased the gas station. Then in 1966, E. Kent Bone decided to make his living running the station. He did so for 45 years, having left a lasting impression on the community with his full service and extreme cleanliness. One interesting point was that Phillips 66 had what was called "Highway Hostesses" who were really registered nurses, and would travel from one station to another (always unannounced), checking for cleanliness. Bone received an award for having passed those impromptu restroom checks. During Bone's lease, (Joy Jensen Simpson/owner) Phillips 66 changed it's name to Conoco, and in 2010, the building became known as the **M & M Service Station**, with Steve Bone and Mohamed providing our community with excellent and efficient service!




