



1300 W and Bennion STORM WATER CIP



This project will install curb, gutter and sidewalk along the east side of 1300 West between Bennion Blvd and 6460 South and along Bennion Blvd between 1530 West and 1300 West. This project has been identified on our capital improvement plan and is identified in the following map as Project #15. This project is currently in design phase and project plans and specifications are scheduled to be done this summer and construction will start spring of 2017. Initial cost estimate put the combined total of the two projects at approximately \$1 million dollars.

A neighborhood meeting is being scheduled for the end of November or early part of December to meet with the neighborhood residents to discuss the project and receive feedback from the community.

Storm Drain Inspection

The city is currently having 3d scanning of portions of the storm drain completed in the southwest corner of the City. This location corresponds with SLCO cleaning the storm drain the month before. The scanning for this project has been completed and linked to the City's GIS data. Currently the scans are being evaluated for potential areas in the storm drain that need to be addressed.

Park Projects

The city is in the process of planning/coordination and design on park facilities for Cabana Club and Vista Park. Vista Park is on track to be completed in November. Big T Recreation was selected to be the playground equipment provider and installer. Strong Solutions and Albretson's Concrete are on board to do the earthworks and concrete work.

The grading work has been completed, irrigation moved and the curb wall installed. Equipment installation should begin the November 28th.

Cabana Club is moving forward. The fence is in the que and playground quotes have been requested from the three pre-qualified vendors. Quotes should be received by the December 6th.

Street Lighting

The city is in the process of upgrading street lighting at crosswalks within the city. Older street lights are being replaced with more efficient and brighter LED bulbs. Mid-block

crossings that correspond with the safe school routes established by the Student Neighborhood Access Program (SNAP) are of particular focus for upgraded or new lighting.


Similar Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacon (RRFB) that were installed on 2700 West next to Bennion Junior High School will be installed on the two mid-block cross walks on 2700 West, one just south of 5280 South and the other just north of Central Park Way. Two additional locations, 3200 West and 5620 South & 4800 South and 1365 West are currently scheduled with the county to have RRFB placed.

We have been updating the City's GIS mapping to allow for outages and street light upgrades requests to be performed using GIS handheld mobile devices.

We have met with RMP and have asked them to develop costs for the purchase of the lights by the city.



Storm Sewer System Improvements Project (EPA Grant Program)



In order to effectively manage the storm drainage system to maintain storm water quality, plan for capital improvement projects, and minimize catastrophic events it is critical to know where the pipes, manholes, boxes, open channels, and other storm drainage facilities are located. The project will use a camera with GPS locator to find locations of the storm drain in high priority areas; this is based on the age of the infrastructure, knowledge of the system, and areas of past flooding. This information will be used to obtain and maintain infrastructure quality.

This project has multiple benefits for the storm water system that include updated storm water inventory with GIS, removal of silt and debris from the storm water pipes, added maintenance to the storm water system, adding devices to help clean the storm water, disconnecting storm drainage from irrigation systems and reduce flooding in areas.

We are currently identifying locations that need to be investigated based on past GPS/GIS data on the storm drain system. Mapping and specifications for video observation and small construction project are being prepared.

Redwood Road Beautification Project

This project includes improvements along Redwood Road between 4100 South and 5400 South. Improvements include sidewalk, curb/gutter, landscaping, utility relocations and intersection improvements. Funding from WFRC with the project has been obtained and the project is being reviewed to determine the project costs based on the plan in hand and project plans from JUB Engineering. In meeting with WFRC and UDOT questions about the cost and inclusion of the burial of the utilities along this corridor have been raised. Forsgren is currently going through the plans and developing a quantity summary sheet to determine project costs using UDOT pricing. WFRC will not fund the burial of the utilities as they consider the burial a betterment

and not a relocation, which would be an eligible cost to the project. It appears that the cost of burial of the utilities was included in the overall project costs but numbers are still being determined.

UDOT UPDATES

Information from UDOT

I-215 reconstruction continues from 4700 South to S.R. 201. Please be aware of the following project activities and upcoming traffic impacts:

Mainline I-215

- All southbound traffic between S.R. 201 and 4700 South is now shifted onto the new concrete median and work has begun on the travel lanes in this area.
 - There is a lane split within the traffic shift from S.R. 201 to 4100 South with two lanes of traffic on each side. **Traffic exiting at 3500 South must be in the two outside lanes in order to exit.**
 - In order to improve the flow of traffic and to maintain safety during the traffic split, **the westbound S.R. 201 loop ramp to southbound I-215 is closed through January.** Crews will use this time to replace the concrete on the ramp. Drivers on westbound S.R. 201 should take an alternate exit to travel south. Drivers can also use westbound I-80 to access southbound I-215 as an alternate.
- Crews are removing the concrete on mainline I-215 in the southbound lanes near 3500 South and moving south. Crews will be breaking concrete during the daytime, and hauling it out overnight. Nearby businesses and residents should expect additional noise and vibration during these activities.

4700 South Interchange

- Crews are working on the southbound I-215 off-ramp to 4700 South through next week as they complete signage and lighting.
- Crews are working on the eastbound 4700 South on-ramp to southbound I-215 for the next two weeks as they complete barriers, signage, and metering.
- Work on 4700 South is wrapping up as crews will spend the next week completing work in the shoulder and signage.
- Drivers should use caution through this interchange as final traffic configurations are put into place.

3500 South Interchange

- Crews continue to remove a portion of the concrete on top of the I-215 bridge at 3500 South and will continue through next week. Drivers should expect overnight lane closures on 3500 South while this is completed.

S.R. 201 Interchange

- Crews are reconstructing the eastbound S.R. 201 ramp to southbound I-215. This ramp will be reconstructed one half at a time and will remain open to drivers.
- Crews continue to build the new southbound I-215 bridge at S.R. 201 adjacent to the temporary bridge currently holding traffic. This new bridge is scheduled to be complete in early 2017.

As a reminder, all travel lanes are open in each direction during daytime hours Monday through Friday. I-215 is reduced to two lanes in each direction during nights and weekends. All lanes are shifted and narrower throughout the work zone, so drivers should use caution and adhere to the 60 mph speed limit.
