**Note:** the qualifications to be a candidate are:

1. Be a United States citizen at time of filing.
2. Be at least 18 years old at the time of the next municipal election.
3. Must be a registered voter of the municipality.
4. Must be a resident of the municipality for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election.
5. If elected from a council district, the person must be a resident of that council district.
6. In accordance with Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to hold elective office is restored under Section 20A-2-101.5.
