1     **1.     WELCOME, INTRODUCTION AND PRELIMINARY MATTERS**

2  
3     18:30:24 Chairman Dama Barbour called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and welcomed those  
4     in attendance. City Recorder Cheryl Peacock Cottle conducted a Roll Call, wherein all Council  
5     Members were present.

6  
7     18:31:04 Members of Scout Troop 235 were recognized.

8  
9             **1.1     Opening Ceremonies – Pledge of Allegiance**  
10             **– Youth Council Member Marin McIff**

11  
12     18:31:39 Youth Council Member Marin McIff directed the Pledge of Allegiance.

13  
14             **1.2     Reverence – Youth Council Member Katie Clark (Opening Ceremonies**  
15             **For April 17, 2013 to be arranged by Council Member Burgess)**

17     18:32:09 Youth Council Member Katie Clark offered the Reverence.

19             **1.3     Citizen Comments**

21     18:33:15 Chairman Dama Barbour reviewed the Citizen Comment Procedures for the audience.  
22     She then called for any citizen comments.

27             **1.4     Mayor’s Report**

28  
29                     **1.4.1    Proclamation Designating April 2013 as Child Abuse Prevention**  
30                     **Month**

31  
32     18:33:50 Mayor Jerry Rechtenbach read a proclamation designating April 2013 as *Child Abuse*  
33     *Prevention Month* in the City of Taylorsville. The Mayor announced that on Saturday, April 6,  
34     2013, the Prevent Child Abuse Utah Agency will sponsor an event at Taylorsville City Hall.

35  
36     18:36:43 Renee Sorensen, with the Taylorsville Exchange Club, relayed that she sits on the  
37     Prevent Child Abuse Awareness Committee and serves Prevent Child Abuse Utah. She thanked  
38     the City of Taylorsville for its past support of child abuse awareness. Trina Taylor, with Prevent  
39     Child Abuse Utah, described programs her agency sponsors to work with families and keep  
40     children safe. She described a *Pinwheels for Prevention* Campaign that will be held Saturday,  
41     April 6, 2013, at 10:00 a.m., at Taylorsville City Hall. She cited goals to give away 75,000

1 pinwheels and place pinwheel gardens in every county throughout Utah. She referenced more  
2 information available on child abuse educational programs at [www.preventchildabuseutah.org](http://www.preventchildabuseutah.org).

8 18:41:19 Chair Dama Barbour recognized Courtney Woffinden and nominated her to serve on  
9 the Taylorsville Public Safety Committee.

10  
11 18:41:24 Council Member Brad Christopherson **MOVED** to appoint Courtney Woffinden as a  
12 member of the Taylorsville Public Safety Committee. Council Member Larry Johnson  
13 **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Dama Barbour called for discussion on the motion. There  
14 being none, she called for a roll-call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Barbour-yes,  
15 Overson-yes, Johnson-yes, and Christopherson-yes. **All City Council members voted in favor  
16 and the motion passed unanimously.**

17  
18 **2.2 Cary Davis to the Budget Committee - *Chairman Barbour***

19  
20 18:42:04 Chair Dama Barbour recognized Cary Davis and nominated him to serve on the  
21 Taylorsville Budget Committee.

22  
23 18:42:15 Council Member Kristie Overson **MOVED** to appoint Cary Davis as a member of the  
24 Taylorsville Budget Committee. Council Member Ernest Burgess **SECONDED** the motion.  
25 Chairman Dama Barbour called for discussion on the motion. There being none, she called for a  
26 roll-call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Barbour-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-yes,  
27 and Christopherson-yes. **All City Council members voted in favor and the motion passed  
28 unanimously.**

29  
30 **3. REPORTS**

31  
32 **3.1 Unified Police Dept., Taylorsville Precinct Awards Presentation**  
33 **- *Deputy Chief Wyant***

34  
35 18:43:09 Unified Police Department (UPD) Taylorsville Precinct Deputy Chief Tracy Wyant  
36 presented awards, as follows:

37  
38 Detective Chris Walden was recognized as *Officer of the Month* for January. The Chief relayed  
39 that Detective Walden recently followed through with a labor intensive narcotics investigation,  
40 resulting in eight arrests (5 five students and three adults). Chief Wyant commended Detective

1 Walden for going above and beyond his regular duties and assignments during this successful  
2 investigation.

3  
4 Detective Jesse Allen was recognized as *Officer of the Month* for February. It was relayed that  
5 Detective Allen investigated a burglary that resulted in the arrest of multiple suspects for 24  
6 felony offenses and the recovery of a significant amount of stolen property.

7  
8 Chief Wyant presented a *Division Commander Award* to Officer Jason Richman. The Chief  
9 explained that in November, 2012, Officer Richman observed a suspicious vehicle with an  
10 unconscious driver who was later determined to have experienced a seizure. It was noted that,  
11 due to Officer Richman's quick actions, further injury and property damage were prevented.

12  
13 Chief Wyant invited Sgt. Mike Ricketts, West Valley K9 Officer Darin Hoover, Officer Brett  
14 Miller, Officer Nicholas Warrick, Officer Bradford Sousley, and Officer Jeff Sanderson to come  
15 forward and receive *Division Commander Awards*. The Chief relayed that these officers were  
16 dispatched to a domestic dispute where they discovered a gunshot victim. He explained that  
17 officers then cleared the home in an effort to find the suspect and later tracked the suspect to a  
18 school where he had committed suicide. Chief Wyant commended Sgt. Ricketts for his  
19 professionalism, experience, and diligence in supervising a very tough situation. He also  
20 recognized the other officers for responding collectively and efficiently when dealing with the  
21 event.

22  
23 18:52:25 Chair Barbour thanked Taylorsville officers for their extraordinary efforts and fine  
24 service to the community.

### 25 26 **3.2 Youth Council Report – Erin Penrose, Youth Council Chair**

27  
28 Youth Council Chair Erin Penrose wished Council Member Kristie Overson a happy birthday.  
29 She cited recent activities of the Taylorsville Youth Council, as follows: attended Utah State  
30 University (USU) Youth Council Conference in Logan, Utah; and helped with Easter Egg hunts  
31 in the city. Ms. Penrose relayed that Youth Council elections will be held next month.

32  
33 18:54:48 Chair Barbour commended Taylorsville Youth Council Members for their efforts at  
34 the USU Conference. She also recognized Council Coordinator / Youth Council Advisor Jessica  
35 Springer for her leadership with the Youth Council.

36  
37 18:56:12 Council Member Kristie Overson cited the fine caliber of youth and future leaders  
38 serving on the Taylorsville Youth Council.

39  
40 Ms. Springer noted that a video of events at the USU Youth Council Conference will be shown  
41 at a later date.

1 Mayor Rechtenbach also commended members of the Taylorsville Youth Council for their  
2 service to the City.

4 **4. CONSENT AGENDA**

5  
6 **4.1 Minutes – RCCM 03-06-13 & 03-13-13**

7  
8 18:56:42 Council Member Larry Johnson **MOVED** to adopt the Consent Agenda. Council  
9 Member Brad Christopherson **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Dama Barbour called for  
10 discussion on the motion. There being none, she called for a roll-call vote. The vote was as  
11 follows: Burgess-yes, Barbour-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-yes, and Christopherson-yes. **All**  
12 **City Council members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.**

13  
14 **5. PLANNING MATTERS**

15  
16 **5.1 Public Hearing - 6:30 p.m. - To Receive Public Comment for a Proposed**  
17 **Zoning Map Amendment**

18  
19 18:58:02 Community Development Director Mark McGrath described 3.3 acres of property on  
20 Sunstone Road. He illustrated aerial photos of the property and pointed out surrounding land  
21 uses. He also illustrated the property on the zoning map and the proposed land use map. He  
22 explained that the proposed amendment is to facilitate a Planned Unit Development (PUD) for  
23 single family homes by Ivory Homes. He noted that the proposal will also go before the  
24 Taylorsville Planning Commission. He indicated that this proposed development will be very  
25 similar to the project across from Taylorsville City Hall behind the credit union.

26  
27 19:01:40 Chairman Barbour opened the public hearing on this matter and called for comments.

28  
29 19:02:13 Nick Mingo, representing Ivory Development, cited recent meetings held with  
30 neighbors along 4800 South near the proposed development. He relayed that several  
31 neighborhood concerns were addressed and Ivory was able to facilitate all requests, except a  
32 request for no two-story homes. He cited conversations with Jerry Milne who has concerns with  
33 two-story homes being located behind his own property.

34  
35 19:04:55 Mr. Mingo addressed questions from the Council regarding the size of homes and lots  
36 for the proposed development. He indicated that several options, i.e. landscaping ideas, are  
37 being considered in order to further address the concerns of neighbors.

38  
39 19:07:48 Jerry Milne illustrated properties he owns that abut the proposed development. He  
40 indicated that he agrees with the approved zoning change, but proposes moving wider lots  
41 behind his properties and placing two-story homes near the apartments. He suggested planting

1 Columnar Spruce trees and modifying landscaping in order to maintain privacy for neighbors.  
2 Mr. Milne also cited concerns with fencing and suggested that uniform vinyl fencing be  
3 implemented. He indicated that he would like rambler-style homes built on the south side.  
4

5 19:13:14 Chairman Barbour noted that the issue for discussion tonight only concerns the zoning  
6 amendment. Mr. McGrath noted that specific details for the PUD will be brought before the  
7 Planning Commission and another public hearing will be held at a future time, with notice given  
8 to surrounding residents.  
9

10 19:14:09 Douglas Arnesen expressed concerns about the small size of lots proposed for the  
11 development.  
12

13 19:21:37 There were no additional citizen comments, and Chairman Barbour declared the public  
14 hearing closed. She called for further discussion by the City Council.  
15

16 19:15:44 Council Member Larry Johnson asked Nick Mingo to come forward to address  
17 concerns. Council Member Johnson suggested that vinyl fencing be included as part of the  
18 project. He also asked about rambler style homes being built on lots. Mr. Mingo indicated that  
19 further discussion will be held and consideration will be given to these requests.  
20

21 19:17:09 Council Member Overson thanked Mr. Mingo for meeting with concerned residents.  
22 She also encouraged Jerry Milne to continue expressing his concerns during the future hearing  
23 before the Planning Commission.  
24

25 19:18:10 Mr. McGrath relayed that this zoning amendment matter went before the Taylorsville  
26 Planning Commission on February 26, 2013 and similar concerns were addressed at that time.  
27 He relayed that the Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the zoning  
28 amendment and was enthusiastic about the opportunity to have another Ivory Development in the  
29 City. Mr. McGrath noted that the City Council can place zoning conditions on the approval, i.e.  
30 a specification for only single-family homes as a land use.  
31

32 19:19:57 Chair Barbour agreed that the fencing issue is very reasonable. Mr. Mingo noted that  
33 fencing was done on the similar existing Ivory PUD. Council Member Overson observed that  
34 fencing is a requirement of a PUD. Mr. McGrath confirmed that fencing is on the list for  
35 Planning Commission consideration.  
36

37 19:20:43 Council Member Christopherson inquired whether Mr. Mingo has any issues with the  
38 Council placing a limitation for only detached single family homes. Mr. Mingo indicated that  
39 there are no concerns and Ivory is only planning single family homes for the development.  
40  
41

1                   **5.1.1 Ordinance No. 13-08 - Amending the Zoning Map R-1-40 (Residential)**  
2                   **to RM-4 (Residential Multi-Family) on Property Located at 4702**  
3                   **South Sunstone Road - *Mark McGrath***  
4

5    19:22:07 Council Member Larry Johnson **MOVED** to adopt Ordinance No. 13-08 - Amending  
6    the Zoning Map R-1-40 (Residential) to RM-4 (Residential Multi-Family) on Property Located  
7    at 4702 South Sunstone Road, with the addition of a zoning condition that limits the  
8    development to detached single-family homes. Council Member Ernest Burgess **SECONDED**  
9    the motion. Chairman Dama Barbour called for discussion on the motion. There being none,  
10   she called for a roll-call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Barbour-yes, Overson-yes,  
11   Johnson-yes, and Christopherson-yes. **All City Council members voted in favor and the**  
12   **motion passed unanimously.**  
13

14    **6.        FINANCIAL MATTERS**  
15

16            **6.1        Tentative 2013/2014 Budget Calendar Presentation - *John Inch Morgan***  
17

18    19:24:36 City Administrator John Inch Morgan illustrated a tentative 2013/2014 Budget  
19    Calendar. He reviewed the calendar, including planned budget discussions. He called for any  
20    recommended modifications to the calendar and agreed to provide copies of the Budget Calendar  
21    to City Council Members.  
22

23    19:30:32 Chair Barbour suggested holding citizen comment periods later in City Council  
24    Meetings, after scheduled budget discussions are conducted, so that residents may hear budget  
25    rationale before making their comments.  
26

27    19:31:11 Council Member Christopherson relayed that he has asked Mr. Morgan and Finance  
28    Director Scott Harrington to prepare both numerical and graphical documents regarding public  
29    safety/police and fire protection. He observed that this information will be helpful in aiding  
30    residents to understand certain challenges that are facing the City Council.  
31

32    19:31:20 Mr. Morgan noted that he will be including a narrative for budgets, as has been done in  
33    the past. He cited a slightly different format for this year's budget that adds an extra column to  
34    the operations budget in order to extend results of budgeting decisions out to the next year.  
35

36    19:34:19 The consensus of the Council was that there are no modifications to the proposed  
37    Budget Calendar. Mr. Morgan agreed to forward the calendar to the Council in its final form and  
38    indicated that he will be adding specific budget topics for each scheduled budget discussion. He  
39    affirmed that budget tabs will still be included.  
40

1 19:35:44 Council Member Overson agreed that scheduling specific budget topics and  
2 parameters for budget discussions is appropriate.

3  
4 **7. OTHER MATTERS**

5  
6 **7.1 Ordinance No. 13-09 - Amending Chapter 2.36.030 (Elections) of the**  
7 **Taylorsville Code of Ordinances - *John Brems***

8  
9 19:36:27 City Attorney John Brems presented the subject ordinance to amend Chapter 2.36.030  
10 of the City Elections Code. He explained that this amendment is necessitated by recent  
11 legislation that has changed the dates for candidate filing in municipal elections. He noted that  
12 the proposed amendment will bring City code into compliance with State code and will adjust  
13 the election filing period to match new State Statute. He indicated that the new dates for this  
14 year's candidate filing period are June 3, 2013 through 7, 2013.

15  
16 City Recorder Cheryl Peacock Cottle confirmed that the new filing dates will be posted on the  
17 City Website.

18  
19 19:38:41 Council Member Brad Christopherson **MOVED** to adopt Ordinance No. 13-09 -  
20 Amending Chapter 2.36.030 (Elections) of the Taylorsville Code of Ordinances. Council  
21 Member Kristie Overson **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Dama Barbour called for  
22 discussion on the motion. There being none, she called for a roll-call vote. The vote was as  
23 follows: Burgess-yes, Barbour-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-yes, and Christopherson-yes. **All**  
24 **City Council members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.**

25  
26 **7.2 Discussion on Salt Lake County Interlocal Agreement Regarding the**  
27 **Homeless - *Mayor Rechtenbach***

28  
29 19:39:39 Mayor Jerry Rechtenbach presented a proposed interlocal agreement with Salt Lake  
30 County regarding the homeless and called for discussion. He described background on the  
31 proposed initiative to ask cities within Salt Lake County to cooperate in contributing to a special  
32 fund (to be held by Salt Lake County) in order to share costs in caring for the homeless. He  
33 noted that this fund would become an annual budget item for each city. The Mayor cited a  
34 proposed contribution amount of \$0.35 per capita for all participating cities, which translates to a  
35 cost of \$20,000 to \$21,000 for Taylorsville. He expressed a desire to bring this matter up now  
36 prior to budget discussions. He agreed to distribute the proposed interlocal agreement to the City  
37 Council. Mayor Rechtenbach noted that the initiative is not mandated and will be solely a  
38 Council decision. He shared some language from the agreement and referenced options before  
39 the Council.  
40

1 19:43:13 Chair Barbour relayed that she has attended a past meeting when this initiative was  
2 discussed. She inquired whether the \$0.35 amount was proposed by Salt Lake City Mayor  
3 Becker and Mayor Rechtenbach confirmed this was the case. Chair Barbour questioned who  
4 will control the proposed fund. The Mayor indicated that the tentative agreement stipulates that  
5 the fund will be managed by the county and distributions will be made through the Council of  
6 Governments (COG). He observed that there are still some questions yet to be answered.

7  
8 19:44:32 Council Member Kristie Overson asked whether the proposed fund would affect the  
9 city's CDBG funds in any way. Mayor Rechtenbach relayed that it would not and these funds  
10 are independent of CDBG.

11  
12 19:45:02 Council Member Brad Christopherson asked for information regarding amounts that  
13 Salt Lake City / Midvale have previously been paying toward caring for the homeless and how  
14 the proposed monetary contribution from other cities was obtained. Mayor Rechtenbach  
15 indicated that he does not know, but will find out.

16  
17 19:45:45 Council Member Ernest Burgess asked if areas with greater needs in caring for the  
18 homeless have been identified. The Mayor indicated that information has not been provided, as  
19 far as he knows.

20  
21 19:45:57 Council Member Larry Johnson asked who proposed the initiative. Mayor  
22 Rechtenbach relayed that Salt Lake City has proposed it; but, they will not receive the money, as  
23 Salt Lake County will essentially be the guardian of the *Council of Government Homeless*  
24 *Services Fund*. Council Member Johnson said he would like more information and the Mayor  
25 agreed to provide such. It was relayed that the agreement is presently scheduled to take effect  
26 July 1, 2013 with a five-year commitment; however, there is no penalty for a city withdrawing  
27 with a 0-day notice being given.

28  
29 19:47:23 Chair Barbour agreed that there is a need to share costs for homeless needs, but  
30 indicated that the Council would like more information.

31  
32 19:47:44 Council Member Burgess thanked the Mayor for keeping the Council informed.

33  
34 19:47:58 Chairman Barbour called for a recess at 7:47 p.m. in order to convene a meeting of the  
35 Redevelopment Agency of Taylorsville City Board.

36  
37 19:48:20 Council Member Ernest Burgess **MOVED** for a recess of the City Council Meeting in  
38 order to convene an RDA Board Meeting. Council Member Kristie Overson **SECONDED** the  
39 motion. Chairman Dama Barbour called for discussion on the motion. There being none, she  
40 called for a roll-call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Barbour-yes, Overson-yes,

1 Johnson-yes, and Christopherson-yes. All City Council members voted in favor and the motion  
2 passed unanimously. The meeting was recessed at 7:48 p.m.
