ORDINANCE NO. 12-14

**AN ORDINANCE DECLARING TWO K-9 ASSETS AND CERTAIN OTHER
POLICE DEPARTMENT PROPERTY OF THE CITY OF TAYLORSVILLE AS
SURPLUS TO THE NEEDS OF THE CITY AND DIRECTING THE CITY
ADMINISTRATOR TO RELIQUISH OWNERSHIP AND ASSIGN THESE
ASSETS IN A MANNER THAT IS IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE CITY**

WHEREAS, on July 11, 2012, the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Taylorsville ("City") met in regular session to consider, among other things, declaring certain property and equipment listed in Exhibit A as surplus to the needs of the City; and directing the City Administrator to relinquish ownership and assign these assets in a manner that is in the best interest of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City owns two K-9 police assets and associated equipment more particularly described on the attached appraisals ("Properties"); and

WHEREAS, these assets were acquired to perform specialized police functions related to drug detection, search activities, and crowd control; and

WHEREAS, the City of Taylorsville has become a full member of the Unified Police Department of Greater Salt Lake and will share in K-9 service needs through the pooled services resources available through that agency; and

WHEREAS, after careful consideration, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Taylorsville to declare these assets listed in Exhibit A as surplus.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council that the assets listed in the attached Exhibit A be declared surplus to the needs of the City; that the City Administrator be instructed to relinquish ownership of the K-9 assets and equipment listed in Exhibit A.

This Ordinance, assigned Ordinance No. 12-14, shall take effect as soon as it shall be published or posted as required by law, deposited and recorded in the office of the City Recorder, and accepted as required herein.
