**RESOLUTION 14-23**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TAYLORSVILLE DECLARING ITS OFFICIAL ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY IN SUPPORT OF COUNTY PROPOSAL NO. 1, THE ZOO, ARTS, AND PARKS AND RECREATION, OR “ZAP”, TAX**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Taylorsville is a municipality and political subdivision of the State of Utah, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §10-1-201, formed and incorporated in accordance with Chapter 10-2 of the same; and

**WHEREAS**, the governing body of a Utah municipality may exercise administrative powers by resolution, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §10-3-717; and

**WHEREAS**, the Taylorsville City Council, has reviewed County Proposal No. 1, which is to go before the voters of Salt Lake County, of which the City is a part, for approval on November 4, 2014; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the stated Vision of the City of Taylorsville to “be a community that provides a desirable quality of life for all residents”; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the stated Mission of the City and its elected officials to “provide efficient and cost effective services that enhance the quality of life” of the members of the community; and

**WHEREAS**, one of the stated Overall Goals of the City is to “Make Life Better”; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council acknowledges that, just as the ZAP tax has done in the past, renewed approval of this tax will allow the members of the City to continue to enjoy the county zoo, public parks, campgrounds, playgrounds, swimming pools, and other indoor and outdoor recreational facilities and trails; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council further acknowledges that the ZAP tax will also support the preservation and advancement of natural history, art, music, theater, dance, other cultural arts, and sciences related to land preservation and animal welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council finds that the ZAP tax will further the above-stated Vision, Mission, and Goals of the City by providing and maintaining recreational, cultural, and educational opportunities for the members of the City and advancing the quality of life of its members of all ages; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council finds it in the best interest of the City to support the ZAP tax and desires to reduce that support into writing.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Taylorsville City Council as follows:

That it is the official administrative policy and position of the City of Taylorsville and its elected officials to SUPPORT the approval of said County Proposal No. 1, aka: the ZAP tax, as well as those actions, events, and purposes that have as their ends its support.

This Resolution, assigned Resolution No. 14-23, shall take effect as soon as it shall be published or posted as required by law, deposited, and recorded in the office of the City Recorder.
