



Draper Historical Museum

The Draper Historical Society was organized in October of 1982 with the aim of preserving and promoting Draper's history. Settled in 1849, just two years after the Mormon Pioneers entered the Salt Lake Valley. Draperville was named after the first Presiding Elder in town, William Draper and finally the name was shortened to Draper.


