## Taylorville Hosts Veterans Day Events

Friday, Nov. 11, Veterans Day events at Taylorville City Hall will be held from 10 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. Here is a list of events that will take place:

10 a.m. - A Black Hawk or Apache Helicopter will be landing outside City Hall (2600 W. Taylorville Blvd). The helicopter will be on display until 1:30 p.m.

10 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. - The largest World War II collection in the state will be on display at Taylorville City Hall, in the Council Chambers. Chip Henneman first became interested in WWII memorabilia at age 5. For more than 30 years he has been collecting items from all branches of service.

11 a.m. - Veterans Day Parade begins at 4900 S. 2700 W. and continues down 2700 West to 5400 South and then east to Taylorville City Hall. Parade features UPD motor squad, several marching bands, and many veterans from all branches of service. Grand Marshals for the parade include the family of Jared William Day, Taylorville resident and Navy Communicator, who was KIA in Afghanistan on Aug. 6, 2011. Co-Grand Marshal is SFC Daniel Nehring, Taylorville resident who has recently served in Iraq and who is one of the models for the Taylorville Veterans Memorial sculpture.

12:15 p.m. - Taylorville Veterans Program (see attached program for details.) The program will include remarks from Governor Gary Herbert and Mayor Russ Wall. It will also include the unveiling of Phase 1 of the Taylorville Veterans Memorial.

Today through Monday - A Field of Honor is set up south of City Hall. It is a memorial to fallen soldiers in Utah who lost their lives in recent wars. There are 44 flags, each with a name attached to represent each soldier who so bravely gave their life for our freedom.
