Poet Robert Frost wrote that “good fences make good neighbors.” Anthony and Melanie Salazar make good fences *and* good neighbors because their home landscape reflects what good neighborhoods in Taylorsville are all about. The Salazars, who own and operate Wasatch Front Fence Company, are this year’s first winner of the Best of Taylorsville award, presented monthly to a residence or business in the city that exemplifies excellent design and care of their property.

Anthony is the brains and brawn behind the family’s neat and colorful yard, located at 1930 W. Condie Drive. After moving into the home 15 years ago, he began a series of improvements that included removing “dirty and messy” trees and shrubs, and replacing them with striking flowers and other plants that compliment the design of the corner property. Spring brings beautiful pansies, daffodils and tulips, followed in the summer by brilliant burning bush, lilac and roses. The well groomed lawn is bordered by attractive, but simple rock and block work. The Salazars say caring for their yard is a great stress relief, a compliment to their neighbors and a source of family and civic pride. “ We do it for us,” says Anthony. “We love Taylorsville. It’s our home.”

At the May 6 City Council meeting, the couple will receive a beautiful plaque donated by Crown Trophy and a basket of goodies from Great Harvest Bread Company. Both are supportive Taylorsville businesses.
