

# Taylorsville Tree Guide

## To PLANT in PARKING/PLANTING STRIPS

Parking/Planting strip --- the area between the street curb and sidewalk usually around four feet wide.

Trees recommended for new and replacement landscaping in Taylorsville Urban Forest.

Hardiness Zones 4-7

<b>Washington Hawthorne (Crataegus Phenopyrum)</b>	Size 35ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green in summer and nice color in fall. Several nice cultivars available.
<b>Eastern Redbud (Cercis Canadensis)</b>	Size 25ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green in summer/yellow fall color.
<b>Paperbark Maple (Acer Griseum)</b>	Size 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Colorful bark and fall color.
<b>American Hornbeam (Carpinus Caroliniana)</b>	Size 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Green in summer, yellow/orange fall color.
<b>Smoke Tree (Cotinus Coggyria)</b>	Size less than 20ft. Abundant pink/purple flowers, red/purple summer foliage and scarlet fall color.
<b>Flowering Pear (Pyrus Calleryana) Var. Chanticleer, Autumn Blaze, Beech Hill</b>	Size 30ft. to less than 60ft. high depending on cultivar. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts depending on cultivar. Shiny green summer, red fall color. Self shaping; requires little pruning, very nice..
<b>Amur Maple (Acer Ginnala)</b>	Size up to 20ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green in the summer and red fall color.
<b>Thunder cloud Plum (Prunus Cerasifera)</b>	Size up to 20ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Purple leaves during growing season.
<b>Crabapple (Malus)</b>	Size up to 20ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green. Several good cultivars available as long as they produce persistent fruit. Wonderful spring flower colors available: white & dark pink.
<b>Golden Rain (Koelreuteria Paniculata)</b>	Size 25ft. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green in summer, yellow in fall. Beautiful long panicles of yellow flowers in mid summer.
<b>Golden Chain (Laburnum Watereri-Vossi)</b>	Size 25ft. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green summer/red fall.
<b>Hedge Maple (Acer Campestere)</b>	Size 30 ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green summer, yellow fall. Cultivars: Queen Elizabeth.
<b>Japanese Flowering Cherry (Kwanzan) (Prunus Serrvata)</b>	Size up to 20ft. Green in summer, yellow fall color, beautiful double pink blossoms in spring.
<b>Japanese Flowering Cherry (Sergeant) (Prunus Serralta)</b>	Size up to 40ft. Green summer, yellow fall color. White spring flowers.
<b>Sunburst Honey Locust (Gleditsia Triacanthous)</b>	Size up to 40ft. Yellow/gold in fall, green in summer, seedless, small leaves and thorn less branches.
<b>Single Leaf Ash (Fraxinus Anomala)</b>	Size 20ft. Yellow/Gold in fall.
<b>Rocky Mountain Maples (Acer Campestre)</b>	Size 30ft. Orange/Red fall color.
<b>Red Horse Chestnut (Aesculus x Carnea)</b>	Size 30ft to 35ft. Medium tolerant to poor drainage, drought, alkalinity, salt and shade. Beautiful upright large panicles of red spring flowers.

## SMALL TREES

(H) Hardiness Zone

<b>Tricolor Beech (Fagus Purpurea Tricolor)</b>	H Zone 4-7 height up to 20ft. Multicolored leaves, very attractive, a nice specimen tree.
<b>Service Berry (Amelanchier Alnifolia)</b>	H Zone 5-9 height 12ft. Nice reddish fall colors. Cultivars: Autumn Brilliance, Coles select, Princess Diana
<b>Choke Cherry (Prunus Virginiana)</b>	H Zone 2-9, Height under 20ft, Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Purple and green leaves on tree at some time in the summer.
<b>Crabapple (Malus)</b>	H Zone 3-8, Height up to 20ft. Growth rate medium. Tolerant to soil compaction, most soils, tolerant to deicing salts. Many beautiful cultivars available, as long as they produce persistent fruit. Spectacular spring flower display. Every home should have a couple!
<b>Eastern Red Bud (Cercis Canadensis)</b>	H Zone 3-9. Height under 20ft., Growth rate 12-24 inches per year, yellow fall colors.
<b>Dwarf Mugo Pine (Pinus Mugo Mugus)</b>	'Slowmound' H Zone 2 Height 15ft. Slow growing.
<b>Dwarf Norway Spruce (Picea Pungenes)</b>	H Zone 2-7, Height to 25ft. Soils, tolerant to deicing salts, green.
<b>Smoke Tree (Cotinus Coggyria)</b>	H Zone 4-9, height less than 20ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Color pink/purple blossoms and leaves. Cultivar: royal purple. Has scarlet red color in fall.
<b>Single Leaf Ash (Fraxinus Anomala)</b>	H Zone 6-9, Size 20ft., Growth rate less than 12 inches per year. Yellow/Gold in fall.
<b>Autumn Applause Ash (Fraxinus---)</b>	H Zone 3-9, size up to 40ft. Most soils, tolerant to soil compaction. Green in summer, purple in fall.
<b>Magnolia (Magnolia)</b>	H Zone 4-5, height 20ft – 40ft. One of the first trees to blossom in the spring. Flowers may be fragrant. Select Cultivars tolerant to alkaline soils.
<b>Japanese Flowering Cherry (Kwanzan) (Prunus Serrvata)</b>	H Zone 5-8 Size up to 20ft. Green in summer, yellow fall color, spectacular double pink blossoms.
<b>Japanese Flowering Cherry (Sergeant) (Prunus Serralta)</b>	H Zone 5-8 Size up to 40ft. Green in the summer, red in the fall, pink spring flowers.
<b>Thunder Cloud Plum (Prunus Cerasifera)</b>	H Zone 5-8 Up to 20ft. Tolerant to soil compaction, most soils, tolerant to deicing salts, purple color throughout growing season.
<b>Washington Hawthorne (Crataegus Phaenopyrum)</b>	H Zone 3-8. Size 35ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soil. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green in summer, color in fall is orange to red: white blossoms turning to bright red fruit which feed birds in the winter.
<b>Hawthorn (Crataegus Lavoile, Carrierei)</b>	H Zone 4-8, Height under 30ft., Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Nice reddish fall colors, also colorful berries which persist during winter. Many nice cultivars available.

## SMALL TREES – cont'd

Hardiness Zones 4-8

<b>Paperbark Maple (Acer Griseum)</b>	Size 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Colorful bark.
<b>Hedge Maple (Acer Campestre)</b>	Size 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green in the summer, yellow in the fall. Cultivars, Queen Elizabeth.
<b>Amur Maple (Acer Ginnala)</b>	Size up to 20ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green in the summer, red fall color.
<b>Rocky Mountain Maples (Acer Campestre)</b>	Size 30ft. Orange/Red fall color.
<b>American Hornbeam (Carpinus Caroliniana)</b>	Size 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Green.
<b>Flowering Pear (Pyrus Calleryana, Var. Chontecleer, Beechhill or Autumn Blaze)</b>	Size 30ft. to under 60ft high depending on cultivar. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils tolerant to deicing salts depending on cultivar. Green in the summer, red in the fall.
<b>Golden Rain (Koelreuteria Paniculata)</b>	Size 25ft. Most soils, tolerant to deicing salts, green in the summer, rust red in the fall.
<b>Golden Chain (Laburnum Watereri)</b>	Size 25ft. Most soils, tolerant to deicing salts, green in the summer, yellow in the fall.
<b>Sunburst Honey Locust (Gleditsia Triacanthous)</b>	Size up to 40ft. Yellow/Gold in fall, small leaves provide filtered shade.
<b>Seedless Honey Locust (Gleditsia Triacanthous)</b>	Size up to 40ft. Cultivars: Moraine. Yellow/Gold in the fall, purple Robe, long panicles of purple flowers.
<b>Red Horse Chestnut (Aesculus x Carnea)</b>	Size 30ft. to 35ft. Medium tolerant to poor drainage, drought, alkalinity, salt, shade. Beautiful spring flowers. Large fruit.
<b>Chaste Tree (Vitex Agnus – Castus)</b>	Size 6-25ft. Open spreading deciduous shrub tree. Compound leaves. Bears small tubular fragrant flowers in late summer.
<b>Viburnum</b>	Many species of evergreen, semi evergreen and deciduous shrubs, sometimes trees. Early fragrant spring flowers. Can be trimmed and shaped. Height up to 8 feet. Glossy green leaves.
<b>Lilac (Syringa Vulgaris)</b>	French lilac. Many varieties. ie: Charles Joly, Cango, Mrs Edward Harding, etc.) Shrub/small tree up to 8 feet. Very nice fragrant flowers in spring.
<b>Mock Orange (Philadelphus x Virginals, Minnesota Snowflake)</b>	H Zone 3-7 Height 8 feet. Very fragrant double white blossoms in spring.

## MEDIUM TREES – 20 feet to 40 feet high

<b>Western Red Birch (Occidentalis Fontinalis)</b>	H Zone 3. Height 30 ft. Cinnamon bark. Yellow/Orange leaves in fall.
<b>European Beech (Fagus Sylvatica)</b>	H Zone 4-7. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate less than 12 inches per year. Oval shape cultivars: Purple Beech, Swayck Beech, Red Obelisk Beech, Rhoanii Beech, Tricolor Beech, Contorted Beech.
<b>Horn Beam (Carpinus Betulus)</b>	H Zone 4-8. Height more 20-40 ft. Growth rate less than 12 inches per year. Round shape.
<b>American Holly (Ilex Opaca)</b>	H Zone 4-8. Height 40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Yellow/Gold in fall. Cultivars: Glenleven, Greenspire, Olympic Rancho, Redmond.
<b>Magnolias (Magnolia)</b>	H Zone 3-8. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year or less. Cultivars which tolerate alkaline soils are: M. Kabus, M. x Laebneri, M. Stellata, M. Siebaldii, M. Wilsanii
<b>Flowering Pear (Pyrus Calleryana)</b>	H Zone 5. Height 35-40ft., White flowers in spring. Red/Orange to purple leaves in fall. Many good cultivars of the Bradford Pear are available, asuch as Aristocrat, Capital, Chantileer, Cleveland select, Respire, Stonehill, Trinity. Excellent self shaping trees with spectacular fall color.
<b>Single Leaf Ash (Fraxinus Anomala)</b>	H Zone 6-9. Height 20ft. or less. Growth rate less than 12 inches per year. Leaves Yellow/Gold in fall.
<b>Japanese Pagoda Tree (Sophora Japonica)</b>	H Zone 4-8. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year.
<b>Ohio Buckeye (Aesculus Glabra)</b>	H Zone 3-7. height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year.
<b>Japanese Flowering Cherry (Prunus Serrulata)</b>	H Zone 6-9. Height 45ft. Spread 30ft., Green in the summer, red in the fall.
<b>Sargent Cherry (Prunus Sargentii or Kwanzon)</b>	H Zone 5-9, Height 45ft. spread 30ft. Green in the summer, red in the fall.
<b>Paperbark Maple (Acer Griseum)</b>	H Zone 4-8. Size 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Colorful bark. Yellow fall color.
<b>American Hornbeam (Carpinus Caroliniana)</b>	H Zone 3-9. Size 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Green.
<b>Rocky Mountain Maples (Acer Glabrum)</b>	H Zone 2-8 Size 30ft. Round shape. Orange/red fall color.
<b>Silk Tree – Mimosa (Albizia Julibrissin)</b>	H Zone 5-7. Height and spread 30ft. Pink flowers in fall.
<b>Hedge Maple (Acer Campestere)</b>	H Zone 4-8. Size 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green summer/yellow fall. Cultivars, Queen Elizabeth.
<b>Golden Rain (Koelruteria Paniculata)</b>	H Zone 5-9. Height 30ft. Spread 25ft. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green.
<b>Golden Chain (Laburnum Watereri)</b>	H Zone 5-7. Height 30ft. Spread 25ft. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green summer. Weeping forms are available. Beautiful hanging pendulants of yellow spring flowers.
<b>Amur Maple (Acer Ginnala)</b>	H Zone 2-8. Size up to 25ft. Round shape. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Green in the summer, red in the fall.
<b>Thunder Cloud Plum (Prunus Cerasifera)</b>	H Zone 5-8. Height and spread 30ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts. Purple foliage throughout growing season.
<b>Fruitless Mulberry (Morus.alba)(‘chaparral)</b>	H Zone 5. Height 42ft. (‘Kingan’) H Zone 6. Yellow fall color. Fast growing, good shade.

## LARGE TREES – 40 feet high or more

<b>Hackberry</b> ( <i>Celtis Occidentalis</i> )	H Zone 2-9. Height and spread 70ft. growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Vase shape. Has yellow to red fall color. Some cultivars available. Edible ½” fruit.
<b>Ginkgo</b> ( <i>Ginkgo Biloba</i> )	H Zone 3-9. Height up to 40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Oval shape. Fall color yellow. Several cultivars available. Interesting leaves, a living fossil tree.
<b>Sycamore</b> ( <i>Acer Pseudoplatanus</i> )	H Zone 5-8. Height and spread 100 X 50 ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Oval shape. Leaves, in the fall turn brown. Var. “Bloodgood” Good shade tree, large spiky fruit.
<b>Green Ash</b> ( <i>Fraxinus Pennsylvanica</i> )	H Zone 5-8. Height and spread 70ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Oval shape. Yellow fall color. Several good cultivars available.
<b>Japanese Zelkova</b> ( <i>Zelkova Serrata</i> )	H Zone 5-8. Height 40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Vase shape. Noted for bark and foliage, with yellow fall color. “Village green” has red fall color. An excellent tree for this area, more should be planted.
<b>Tulip Tree</b> ( <i>Liriodendron Tulipifora</i> )	H Zone 4-9. Height 40 feet. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Oval shape. Flower in spring, with yellow fall color. Leaves resemble a tulip flower.
<b>Thornless Honey Locust</b> ( <i>Gleditsia Tracanthos Inermis</i> )	H Zone 5-9. Height and spread up to 40ft. Round shape. Yellow fall color. Try cultivars such as Ruby Lace with bronze red young leaves (skyline), (shade master), all are mostly thorn less with small seed pods.
<b>Kentucky Coffee Tree</b> ( <i>Gymnocladus Dioyica</i> )	H Zone 5-9. Height and spread 70 X 50ft. White flowers. Yellow in fall. Great tree but has large seed pods.
<b>Yellowwood</b> ( <i>Cladrastis Lutea</i> )	H Zone 4-9. height and spread up to 40 ft. Round shape. Flowers in summer. Yellow color in fall.
<b>Bald Cyprus</b> ( <i>Taxodium Diaticum</i> )	H Zones 5-10. Height and spread 70 X 30ft Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Green leaves that turn brown and drop in fall.
<b>Horse Chestnut</b> ( <i>Aesculus Hippocastanum</i> )	H Zone 4-7. Height and spread 100 X 50ft White flowers in mid summer. Fruit in fall may be messy. Some cultivars have pink and red flowers.
<b>Oaks-English, Bur, Northern Red, Scarlet, White</b> ( <i>Quercus ---</i> )	H Zone 4-8. Height and spread up to 40 feet.
<b>Maple</b> ( <i>Acer Platanoides</i> )	H Zone 4-7. Size 40ft. to 50ft. Tolerant to soil compaction. Most soils. Tolerant to deicing salts.
<b>Crimson King Norway</b>	Maroon-bronze foliage. (red colors may not color up in fall because of soil chemistry.
<b>Emerald Queen Norway</b>	Green in summer, yellow in fall.
<b>Sugar Maples</b> ( <i>Acer Saccharum</i> )	H Zone 4. Most are over 40ft high and not tolerant to poor drainage and deicing salts condidtion. Red/Orange fall color.
<b>American Sweetgum</b> ( <i>Liquidambar Styracifua</i> )	H Zone 4-9. Height and spread 80 X 40ft. Glossy green leaves turn deep reddish purple in fall. Several other cultivars available. Good fall color: yellow – reds.
<b>Homestead Elm</b> ( <i>Ulmus ‘homestead’</i> )	H Zone 5, Height 55ft. Dutch elm disease resistant. Yellow fall color.
<b>Beech</b> ( <i>Fagus</i> )	H Zone -4. Height 30ft – 70ft growth rate less than 12 inches per year. Many good cultivars.

## LARGE CONIFERS

<b>Japanese White Pine (Pinus Parviflora)</b>	H Zone 6-9. Height and spread 40ft. X 20ft. Oval shape. Growth rate less than 12 inches per year.
<b>Deodar Cedar (Cedrus Deodara)</b>	H Zone 7-9. Height more than 40ft. Pyramidal shape. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year.
<b>Norway Spruce (Picea Abies)</b>	H Zone 3-8. Height and spread 70 – 100ft. X 15 – 22ft. Pyramidal shape. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year.
<b>Englemann Spruce (Picea Engelmannii)</b>	H Zone 3-8. Height and spread 45ft. X 20ft. Pyramidal shape. Growth rate less than 12 inches per year.
<b>White Spruce (Picea Glauca)</b>	H Zone 3-6. Height and spread 30-50ft. X 12-15ft. Pyramidal shape. Growth rate less than 12 inches per year. Many nice cultivars.
<b>Austrian Pine (Pinus Nigra)</b>	H Zone 4-7. Height over 40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Very hardy and fast growing. Long needles can become a messy problem if they drop on shrubs or flower beds.
<b>Dawn Redwood (Metasequoia Glyptostroboides)</b>	H Zone 5-10. Height and spread 60ft. X 20ft. Growth rate more than 24 inches per year. Pyramidal shape.
<b>Scots Pine (Pinus Sylvestris)</b>	H Zone 5-10. Height and spread 60ft. X 20ft. Growth rate more than 24 inches per year. Pyramidal shape.
<b>Colorado Blue Spruce (Picea Pungens)</b>	H Zone 3-8. Height over 50ft. Longevity greater than 50 years. Several dwarf cultivars are available. Picea Pungens will grow very large, don't plant close to structures or driveways, give it much room to grow.

<b>Columnar Scotch Pine (Pinus---)</b>	H Zone 3-7. Height under 20ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year.
<b>Mugo Pine (Pinus Mugo)</b>	H Zone 2-7. Height under 20ft. Shape is low and wide
<b>Dwarf Norway Spruce (Picea Abies)</b>	H
<b>Columnar Scotch Pine (Clanbrassiliana)</b>	H Zone 2-8. Height under 20ft.
<b>Japanese Black Pine (Pinus Thunbergiana)</b>	H Zone 5-9. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Longevity more than 50 years. Irregular shape.
<b>South Western White Pine (Pinus Strobiformis)</b>	H Zone 5-9. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Longevity more than 50 years. Pyramidal shape.
<b>Pinyon Pine (Pinuw Edulis)</b>	H Zone 4-8. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Longevity more than 50 years. Round shape. Seeds are edible (pine nuts)
<b>Utah Juniper (Juniperus Osteosperma)</b>	H Zone 4-7. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Longevity more than 50 years. Round shape. Many Juniper varieties available.
<b>Limber Pine (Pinus Edulis)</b>	H Zone 1-4. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate less than 12 inches per year. Longevity over 50 years. Pyramidal shape.
<b>Bristle-cone Pine (Pinus Aristata)</b>	H Zone 4-8. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate less than 12 inches per year.
<b>Black Hills Spruce (Picea Glauca)</b>	H Zone 3-6. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-14 inches per year.
<b>American Holly (Ilex Opaco)</b>	H Zone 5-9. Height 20-40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Irregular shaped. Fruit and foliage are ornamental.
<b>Southern Magnolia (Magnolia Grandiflora)</b>	H Zone 6-9. Height over 40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Pyramidal shape. Flowers and fruit are ornamental features.
<b>Austrian Pine (Pinus Nigra)</b>	H Zone 4-7. Height over 40ft. Growth rate 12-24 inches per year. Longevity more than 50 years. Pyramidal shape.
<b>Scotch Pine (Pinus Sylverstris)</b>	H Zone 3-7. Height over 50ft. Growth rate 12-14 inches per year.
<b>Colorado Blue Spruce (Picea Pungens)</b>	H Zone 3-8. Height over 50ft. Longevity greater than 50 years.
<b>Yews (Taxus)</b>	H Zone 4-7. Height up to 12 feet. Some cultivars are low growing. Very nice, can be trimmed into an evergreen shrub. Good foundation Evergreen.
<b>Euonymus (Euonymus)</b>	Some cultivars in H Zone 4-9. Height 3ft – 15ft. Nice evergreen shrub. Can be trimmed and shaped. A good foundation Evergreen.
<b>Ponderosa Pine (Pinus Ponderosa)</b>	H Zone 5-8, also called the Western Yellow Pine. Grows 80-12 eet. Long needles and large comes. Interesting thick bark.

## TREES to AVOID

- Reasons:
1. May be insect and/or disease prone, especially when stressed.
  2. Weak wood and/or branch structure.
  3. Fruit and/or plant parts can be nuisances; use fruitless varieties if possible
  4. Thorns of spines that can be dangerous; use thornless varieties if possible.
  5. Sucker (sprouts) growth can be a problem.
  6. Water loving.
  7. Evergreen Broad Leaf (retains its leaves for more than one year.)
  8. Deciduous Conifer (loses its needles every year.)
