BRIEFING SESSION

1. Review Administrative Report

18:03:04 Chairman Rechtenbach conducted the Briefing Session, which convened at 6:03 p.m.
City Recorder Cheryl Peacock Cottle conducted a Roll Call, wherein all Council Members were

present. Chairman Rechtenbach called for questions on the Administrative Report for the Community Development Department. Council Member Overson inquired about statistics for the good Landlord Program. Community Development Director Mark McGrath confirmed that there has been an inordinate amount of landlord rental activity based on aggressive code enforcement action in that category. Council Member Overson observed that more than 50% of landlords are participating in the program. She asked about the mood of landlords. Mr. McGrath reported that the mood is not negative.

18:04:50 Council Member Barbour cited the many rentals that are single-family homes. Mr. McGrath confirmed that a lot of single-family homes are being rented out in Taylorsville. He described the process for finding landlords in the City and referenced some initial errors on Salt Lake County data. He reported that the data has now been cleaned up in the City's records. He cited the importance of the Good Landlord program.

1. WELCOME, INTRODUCTION AND PRELIMINARY MATTERS

18:32:02 Chairman Jerry Rechtenbach called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. and welcomed those in attendance. City Recorder Cheryl Peacock Cottle conducted a Roll Call, wherein all Council Members were present.

1.1 Opening Ceremonies – Pledge of Allegiance – Council Member Burgess

18:32:46 Police Detective Jennifer Gober directed the Pledge of Allegiance.

1.2 Reverence – Council Member Burgess (Opening Ceremonies For March 7, 2012 to be arranged by Youth Council)

18:34:35 Deacon George Sluga offered the Reverence.

1.3 Citizen Comments

18:35:58 Chairman Jerry Rechtenbach reviewed the Citizen Comment Procedures for the audience. He then called for any citizen comments.

18:36:53 Ruth Jacobson spoke about flooding issues at her home in the Misty Hills neighborhood. She referenced plans in place to alleviate flooding and asked that the City Council approve the storm drain fix for that area.

18:40:24 Ryan Hancey, Attorney for the Fraternal Order of Police, addressed proposed amendments to the Employee Appeal Board Ordinance. He stated his concern that the proposed changes will tip the balance in favor of the City and against employees. He also suggested that the changes are not in line with current case law.

18:42:58 Chairman Rechtenbach asked Mr. Hancey to present his concerns to Taylorsville City Attorney John Brems. Mr. Hancey and Mr. Brems left the Council Chambers to conduct private discussion.

18:43:46 Charles Christopher referenced discussion during the February 1, 2012 City Council Meeting regarding proposed amendments to the City's elections ordinance. He cited research he has conducted and referenced information from ongoing Supreme Court cases regarding corporate campaign contribution limits. He reviewed ways that campaign limits are structured. He stated his belief that it is unclear whether or not the Supreme Court has allowed contribution limits. Mr. Christopher stated that he has no formal position on this issue, but merely desires to provide information to the Council.

18:46:57 There were no additional citizen comments, and Chairman Rechtenbach closed the citizen comment period.

18:47:27 Chairman Rechtenbach recognized members of Scout Troops 843 and 474, who were in attendance.

1.4 Mayor's Report

1.4.1 Proclamation Appointing Saturday, February 18, 2012 as Congressional Gold Medal Day

18:48:07 Mayor Russ Wall read a proclamation declaring Saturday, February 18, 2012 as *Congressional Gold Medal Day* for the Veterans of the 100th/42nd/MIS, including those from Utah, to be observed at the Little America Hotel in Salt Lake City, Utah.

2. APPOINTMENTS

2.1 ***Resolution No. 12-10*** – Affirming the Appointment of Israel Grossman, District 1; Dan Fazzini, District 2; and Curt Cochran, Alternate; to the Planning Commission – *Chairman Rechtenbach*

18:56:15 Chairman Rechtenbach recognized Israel Grossman, Dan Fazzini, and Curt Cochran and nominated each of them to be appointed as new members of the Taylorsville Planning Commission.

18:57:08 Council Member Kristie Overson **MOVED** to approve Resolution No. 12-10 Affirming the Appointment of Israel Grossman, District 1; Dan Fazzini, District 2; and Curt Cochran, Alternate; to the Taylorsville Planning Commission. Council Member Dama Barbour **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Rechtenbach called for discussion on the motion. There being none, he called for a vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-yes, Rechtenbach-yes, and Barbour-yes. **All City Council members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.**

18:57:55 Chairman Rechtenbach apologized that letters regarding the selection of new Planning Commissioners were mailed to appointees after the agenda listing their appointments was already published.

2.2 **Cathy Jeffs, Lynn Mackay and Lee Ellen Stevens – Ordinance Review Committee** – *Chairman Rechtenbach*

18:58:38 Chairman Rechtenbach recognized Cathy Jeffs, Lynn Mackay and Lee Ellen Stevens and nominated each of them to serve on the Ordinance Review Committee.

18:58:55 Council Member Larry Johnson **MOVED** to appoint Cathy Jeffs, Lynn Mackay and Lee Ellen Stevens to the Ordinance Review Committee. Council Member Dama Barbour **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Rechtenbach called for discussion on the motion. There being none, he called for a vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-yes, Rechtenbach-yes, and Barbour-yes. **All City Council members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.**

18:59:26 Council Member Larry Johnson reminded the new appointees of the next Ordinance Review Committee Meeting on Tuesday, February 21, 2012, at 6:30 p.m., on the second floor of the Taylorsville City Center.

3. REPORTS

3.1 United Veterans Council – *Elmer Inman, Parade Chairman*

19:00:37 Parade Chairman Elmer Inman, of the United Veterans Council, presented Mayor Wall and the City of Taylorsville with a “Citation of Appreciation” for outstanding support of Veterans programs and for organizing the Annual Veterans Day Parade.

4. CONSENT AGENDA

4.1 Minutes – CCWS 01-11-12

19:01:35 Council Member Dama Barbour **MOVED** to adopt the Consent Agenda. Council Member Kristie Overson **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Rechtenbach called for discussion on the motion. There being none, he called for a roll call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-abstain, Rechtenbach-yes, and Barbour-yes. **All City Council members voted and the motion passed.**

5. PLANNING MATTERS

5.1 ***Resolution No. 12-11 – Granting an Exception to the Standards of Roadway Development Required in Title 14, Highways, Sidewalks and Public Spaces, for Property Located at 5455 South Harker Ridge Lane – Mark McGrath***

19:02:50 Community Development Director Mark McGrath relayed that on February 7, 2012 the Taylorsville Planning Commission approved a 27-lot subdivision for single-family homes to be developed by Ivory Homes on property at 5400 South and 2700 West, behind the America First Credit Union.

19:03:58 Mr. McGrath illustrated the subject property on an aerial map and on a subdivision plat map. He explained that the proposed subdivision is not fully compliant with the City’s Highway Ordinance, as the proposed new roads are only 108 feet away from each other. He noted that City code requires unaligned roads to be 150 feet apart, unless an exception is granted by the City Council. Mr. McGrath listed a number of unacceptable alternatives for alignment that would conform with the existing code. He suggested that the best alternative is to keep the 108 foot offset and grant the exception.

19:06:56 Mr. McGrath noted that City Engineer John Taylor has reviewed and approved the exception. He reported that the Planning Commission has also recommended approval of the proposed exception as the best alternative.

Mr. McGrath called for questions. He relayed that the subdivision will have 27 homes with 11 different house plans

19:08:03 Council Member Johnson inquired about zoning for the parcel. Mr. McGrath confirmed that the entire area is zoned for mixed use, which does permit single-family homes.

19:08:47 City Engineer John Taylor confirmed that the option requested by Ivory Homes is the best alternative.

19:09:04 Council Member Johnson questioned whether, if the roads were aligned, the intersection might qualify for a traffic light. Mr. Taylor indicated that it would not qualify.

19:09:27 Council Member Dama Barbour **MOVED** to adopt Resolution No. 12-11 – Granting an Exception to the Standards of the Roadway Development Required in Title 14, Highways, Sidewalks and Public Spaces, for Property Located at 5455 South Harker Ridge Lane. Council Member Larry Johnson **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Rechtenbach called for discussion on the motion. There being none, he called for a roll call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-yes, Rechtenbach-yes, and Barbour-yes. **All City Council members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.**

6. FINANCIAL MATTERS

6.1 Public Hearing – 6:30 p.m. – To Receive Public Comment on Resolution 12-08

19:09:57 City Administrator John Inch Morgan relayed that amendments to the 2011-2012 FY Budget were presented to the City Council on February 1, 2012. He noted that those amendments were discussed during the February 8, 2012 Work Session. He stated that the budget amendments have been made available to the public through the City website, in the Recorder's Office, in the Finance Director's Office and in the City Administrator's Office. Mr. Morgan explained that the public hearing scheduled tonight is for the purpose of soliciting input from City residents regarding the proposed budget amendments.

19:11:24 Chief of Finance Director Scott Harrington described two changes that were made to the proposed mid-year budget, as per direction given at the February 8th Work Session. He cited the first change to the Economic Development Fund on the Salaries and Wage Line Items; it was revised from \$60,000 to \$40,000. He reported that the second change was to recognize veteran memorial donations received last year in the amount of \$88,982.

19:12:43 Council Member Larry Johnson cited funds paid out to Keith Snarr for severance pay and called for clarification. Mr. Morgan confirmed that two months worth of severance pay was paid, along with insurance benefits.

19:13:26 Council Member Larry Johnson inquired whether Mr. Snarr was terminated and whether giving severance pay is in line with normal policy. Mayor Wall clarified that Mr. Snarr was let go, although he was not terminated for cause, and there was no disciplinary action. He said the City no longer needed Mr. Snarr's services and it is not unusual to pay severance out in that situation. Council Member Johnson asked whether it is up to Administration to do so, and the Mayor confirmed that is the case.

19:14:31 Chairman Rechtenbach called for clarification under the Revenue/Expense Summary and inquired how the deficit is made up. Mr. Harrington explained that the majority of the deficit is due to property and sales tax revenues that trend two months behind. He described how and when fees are collected and said the current situation is typical. He confirmed that the numbers shown were accurate as of January 31, 2012.

19:15:53 Mr. Harrington cited tax revenue detail and noted that 95% of property tax has been collected, but sales tax collection is only at about 46%.

19:16:33 Council Member Johnson questioned the salary adjustments of three employees in the Community Development Department. He asked whether these were the same employees who appealed their cases and were denied because they were wrong. Mr. Harrington confirmed that the calculation restores salaries of the three employees referenced, retroactive to the first of the year.

19:15:53 Council Member Johnson said he has heard statements that the wrong people were punished in these cases, but is concerned that citizens will be punished by paying this bill.

19:17:58 Mayor Wall clarified that the Employee Appeal Board did not determine whether the City Council's decision was right or wrong, but only stated that they had authority to reduce salaries. The Mayor suggested that the difference between legal authority and doing the right thing is not clear cut. He confirmed that the salary amounts were previously rolled back out of the budget and this amendment restores that line item.

19:19:32 Council Member Larry Johnson cited concern with buying a lawn mower for \$25,000 and the commitment from the Polynesian community to maintain the City Center property. He noted that if they do not honor their commitment, the City will have to pay someone else for maintenance. Mayor Wall acknowledged that was correct.

19:20:09 Council Member Johnson expressed additional concern about liability if someone in the Polynesian community is hurt while maintaining the property. The Mayor explained that, as volunteers, they are covered under the City's Workers Compensation and Liability Insurance. Mr. Johnson questioned costs for storing the proposed equipment and suggested that costs will exceed \$25,000. He said he would like to see some bids for other maintenance options.

19:21:09 Mr. Morgan clarified that bids were already provided to the Council for review within the last week. Council Member Johnson said he had not seen the bids.

19:21:24 Mayor Wall cited the City's ordinance requiring that property be landscaped and maintained. He suggested the City of Taylorsville has been in violation of its own ordinance for about eight years. He noted that the right equipment is required to maintain such a large piece of property. The Mayor referenced other properties in the City that will be maintained with the industrial equipment planned for purchase.

19:21:51 Council Member Johnson questioned whether maintenance would be cheaper by using a Taylorsville company to mow and trim.

19:22:36 Mr. Morgan clarified that the cost for the mower itself is actually only \$13,000, but a trailer is needed to haul the equipment.

19:23:17 Council Member Johnson inquired about fees for use of the City Center Park. Mr. Morgan stated that a draft policy was previously distributed for input, but will be brought back for discussion at the next City Council Meeting. He reiterated that maintenance bids have already been obtained and provided to the Council.

19:23:47 Mayor Wall confirmed that the Polynesian Community will pay for use of the City Center Park through donation of their labor. The Mayor clarified that Administration has examined options for the property maintenance very carefully and has made a recommendation for what it feels is appropriate. He noted that the City Council can make other recommendations.

19:24:28 Council Member Barbour stated that the City has a responsibility to maintain its parks at a higher level than has been done in the past. She suggested that the City Council should set a policy and a budget for doing so and then let the Administration take it from there.

19:25:22 Discussion was held regarding the maintenance of City parks and the contract for park maintenance that is held with Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation. Mr. Morgan noted that the City has approximately 360 acres of park space to maintain and is paying Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation \$30,000 for that maintenance. He suggested that the County contract is a good deal and a private party could cost about three times as much.

19:29:39 Mr. Morgan cited the additional need for the proposed maintenance equipment to help clean up other City properties as a result of code enforcement efforts.

19:32:25 Council Member Johnson said he is not impressed with the maintenance done by Salt Lake County. Mr. Morgan suggested that the City maintains most of its City-owned parks better than what is seen in some of the regional parks.

19:32:49 Mr. Harrington observed that Administration has looked at several other options and believes that buying the mowing equipment suggested is the best alternative.

19:33:27 Council Member Barbour reiterated that if a higher maintenance standard in parks is required, costs will be higher.

19:33:33 Council Member Johnson said he would like to see some maintenance bids from private companies in the City. Mayor Wall reiterated that those bids have been collected were already e-mailed to the Council. Council Member Johnson stated that he had not seen the e-mail.

19:34:29 Mayor Wall gave clarification on full insurance coverage for volunteers who do work on City events.

19:35:03 Council Member Overson observed that Salt Lake County currently gives the City a pretty good deal, and that the suggested equipment could be used for the City Center property, other City properties, and back lots, etc. She expressed hope that the City will not do maintenance work that should actually be covered under Salt Lake County's contract.

19:36:56 Mayor Wall noted that pressure is currently on the County to get out of public services and, in that case, the choice will have to be made whether to do maintenance in-house, contract with private companies, or create a UFA-type organization to do public works and parks/recreation. He said a consultant is currently evaluating those options. He noted that if Salt Lake County is not contracted for maintenance, costs will be higher and decisions will have to be made. He suggested that the price of the maintenance equipment, amortized over 10 to 15 years, is still a bargain. The Mayor noted that if the Samoan Community chooses not to use the City Center Park and provide labor, there is still the option to deal with another organization or hire someone else to do it.

The Mayor stressed that Administration is always trying to find ways to save taxpayers money and feels that this is the best way to do so.

19:38:42 Council Member Overson inquired about yearly maintenance on the proposed maintenance equipment. Mayor Wall said there is currently a budget line for equipment

maintenance. He noted that the expense for equipment maintenance may increase some, but not by a huge amount.

19:40:01 Council Member Johnson said he cannot find the bids sent and asked if Mr. Morgan can describe the information provided. Mr. Morgan said it is not appropriate to name bids publicly at this time because bids have not yet been awarded. He agreed to re-send the bids to the Council via e-mail.

19:40:44 Chairman Rechtenbach asked for clarification on additional revenues and expenditures and Mr. Harrington cited changes totaling \$666,974 in the General Fund. He referenced the \$1.2 million expense for the 1300 West repair.

19:42:17 Council Member Johnson inquired when response might be received from FEMA on the request for \$1.2 million. Mr. Harrington said he spoke to a FEMA representative recently and the response on the appeal may be back within two to three weeks. He noted that if FEMA denies the appeal, the City can reapply on a national level, which will take additional time.

19:43:44 Chairman Rechtenbach called for any further questions on mid-year budget adjustments.

19:43:49 Mr. Harrington said that sales tax revenue is actually being increased by \$350,000, and not \$333,000.

19:44:12 Mr. Morgan confirmed that the amount of City Center park property with maintenance needs is approximately five acres.

19:44:31 Chairman Rechtenbach opened the public hearing regarding proposed mid-year budget amendments and called for citizen comments.

19:44:47 There were no citizen comments and Chairman Rechtenbach declared the public hearing closed.

6.1.1 Resolution No. 12-08 – Amending the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 General Fund, Capital Improvement Fund, Cemetery Fund and Storm Drain Fund Budgets – *John Inch Morgan*

19:45:01 Council Member Johnson said he is not yet ready to vote on the subject resolution because he still has questions on the City Center Park maintenance. Mr. Morgan suggested that the City Council could pass the resolution, subject to further discussion on solutions to the park maintenance.

19:45:52 Council Member Dama Barbour said she is ready to make a motion at this time.

19:45:59 Chairman Rechtenbach agreed to hear further discussion from Council Member Johnson. Mr. Johnson said he is not ready for more discussion at this time and will need additional time to study bids. Mr. Morgan reiterated that it is not appropriate to discuss bids in an open meeting.

19:48:00 Council Member Ernest Burgess said he is willing to wait until next week if Council Member Johnson is not ready.

19:48:38 Mr. Morgan noted that there is no official deadline to adopt the mid-year budget adjustments.

19:48:58 Mayor Wall called for a point of order. He observed that if a Council Member wants to make a motion, that motion must be recognized and accepted.

19:49:28 Council Member Dama Barbour **MOVED** to adopt Resolution No. 12-08 – Amending the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 General Fund, Capital Improvement Fund, Cemetery Fund and Storm Drain Fund Budgets. Council Member Kristie Overson **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Rechtenbach called for discussion on the motion. There being none, he called for a roll call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-no, Rechtenbach-no, and Barbour-yes. **All City Council members voted and the motion passed with a 3 to 2 vote.**

6.2 Resolution No. 12-09 – Authorizing the Submission of a Grant for Historical Preservation Activities – Joan White - Chair, Historic Preservation Committee

19:50:59 City Administrator John Inch Morgan explained that it was learned recently that the City of Taylorsville does not qualify for the Historical Preservation Grant; therefore, Administration is requesting that the subject resolution be withdrawn from consideration.

19:51:12 Council Member Larry Johnson **MOVED** to remove Resolution 12-09 from consideration. Council Member Dama Barbour **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Rechtenbach called for discussion on the motion. There being none, he called for a roll call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-yes, Rechtenbach-yes, and Barbour-yes. **All City Council members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.**

7. OTHER MATTERS

7.1 Discussion on Potential Amendments to Chapter 2.28, Employee Appeal Board – *John Brems, City Attorney*

19:51:55 Mayor Wall suggested that the potential amendments to the Employee Appeal Board Ordinance be tabled until the March 14, 2012 Work Session for further consideration.

Council Member Larry Johnson **MOVED** to table discussion of potential amendments to Chapter 2.28, regarding the Employee Appeal Board, to the March 14, 2012 Work Session. Council Member Dama Barbour **SECONDED** the motion. Chairman Rechtenbach called for discussion on the motion. There being none, he called for a roll call vote. The vote was as follows: Burgess-yes, Overson-yes, Johnson-yes, Rechtenbach-yes, and Barbour-yes. **All City Council members voted and the motion passed.**

19:53:46 Mayor Russ Wall reported that he recently made a presentation to the Republican Senate Caucus about funding the proposed Taylorsville-Murray Bus Rapid Transit Line. He thanked City Staff for the fine story boards that were provided. He relayed that the presentation was very favorably received. The Mayor said he is hopeful that the Legislature will allocate the \$4 million needed to start engineering on the project. He agreed to report back when he receives more information.

19:54:32 Council Member Larry Johnson inquired about recent promotions in the Police Department. Mayor Wall confirmed that two police officers were recently promoted from sergeant to lieutenants. He noted that the full reorganization is not yet complete. He stated that, once all is finalized, Administration will be reporting to the Council as required by ordinance.

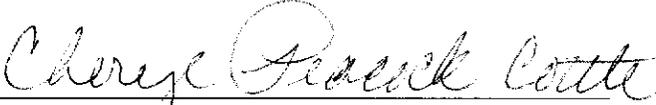
