Snow Regulations

Who thought we were going to dodge the snow this winter? Fortunately for every cloud, there is a silver lining, or in this case, additional water to fill our drinking and yard watering reservoirs and maybe even some of the Great Salt Lake. One area that seems to create a lot of inquiries to the City relates to snow, street parking, and snow removal. Many of you have recently seen the City's snow and overnight parking regulations getting some run on Social Media. It is helpful to remember why the City has these regulations.

The City contracts with Salt Lake County Public Works to plow City streets. This saves taxpayer's money, as the plows that are out doing Salt Lake County roads can also do Taylorsville City Roads without having three different agencies' plows going through the same City to plow three sets of differently owned roads (City, County, & State). They also are intended to save money, by only requiring a single pass (depending on the amount of snow and duration of the storm) on City/County roads. If we have cars parked on the street, the plows must plow around

them and come back later to clean that part of the road, adding additional cost.

When our streets are free from on-street parking, this saves our plows from having to come back later to plow the same street again, thus saving taxpayer's money.

The more efficient our road plowing can be, the safer our roads will be when we get up to go to work as well. Saving our sick and/or vacation days for something we plan, rather than a snow day. Have a safe rest of the Winter!

Snow Removal Reminder for Residents and Businesses



Please clear snow and ice from sidewalks adjacent to your property within 24 hours after a snowfall for the safety of others.

A special thank you to those who volunteer their time & equipment to help neighbors in need of assistance keep properties safe & accessible.

It is unlawful for the owner, occupant, lessor or agent of property abutting on a paved sidewalk to fail to remove or cause to be removed from such paved sidewalk and any existing curb ramp all hail, snow or sleet falling thereon, within twenty four (24) hours after the hail, snow or sleet has ceased falling. 14.32.100



SNOW REMOVAL REMINDERS FOR TAYLORSVILLE RESIDENTS



Traveling, even short distances, during the winter months in Utah can be stressful. Snow and Ice can cause delays and be very dangerous. Salt Lake County Public Works Operations is committed to providing safe, well- maintained roadway systems for the benefit of the public.

Sidewalks and mailboxes are the responsibility of the resident to keep clear. We recommend the sidewalk be cleared after the plows have serviced the area.

Snow team members have been instructed not to clear roads with cars parked on them. Residents may call their local code enforcement or police department to assist with the removal of the cars to enable the plows access to the area. When clearing your driveways and sidewalks, the snow should not be deposited in the road. Garbage cans should be set at the curb in the morning and removed promptly.

Our snow teams are prepared 24 hours a day in the event of a storm. Major arterial streets are the first priority to make passable and provide access to schools, hospitals, fire stations, police and other emergency services.

Snow removal team members are working 12-16 hour shifts and appreciate courteous and friendly drivers. Please use caution when you see a snow removal vehicle and remember the snow removal vehicle is harder to stop than a regular vehicle.

Depending on the size of the storm, teams may need to continually plow these roads, which may delay residential road clearing. After the snow event has ended snow teams will return to residential streets to push the snow back to the curb or edge of the road. This often causes additional snow in driveways. We make every effort to clear all roads within 48 hours after the storm ends.

When the temperatures dropping below 17 degrees the salt used on the road is less effective. The melt rate slows and the snow & ice may take days to completely melt. Drivers need to exercise extreme caution. It is important for residents to understand what they can do to ensure the roads and sidewalks are safe and passable.

Green Waste Program



The Weekly Green Waste Collection Program will resume beginning Thursday, March 22nd for Taylorsville residents. Taylorsville currently has 701 subscribers. This is a subscription program that helps divert green waste from the landfill to be processed into mulch that can be purchased for use from the Salt Lake Valley and Trans-Jordan Landfills. At \$114 per year, a green waste can is less expensive than an additional black refuse can. Landscape Maintenance



Now is the perfect time of year to trim your trees! Salt Lake County Ordinance 14.12.050, and other municipal ordinances, require that trees and landscaping which overhangs the street pavement need to be trimmed to a minimum height of thirteen and one half feet (13 ½ feet) above the street pavement. Following these guidelines will help our trucks navigate through your neighborhood and empty your cans without potential damage to your trees and our trucks. We appreciate your help






TAYLORSVILLE BENNION CHAPTER OF SONS OF THE UTAH PIONEERS

Tipping the Scales

Rates for water and sewer changed March 1st. This is due to the outcome of an in-depth financial analysis, more fixed costs are now built into the base rates. The reallocation of costs resulted in an increased water base rate, which is counterbalanced by a decrease in the usage rate.



Overall, the changes will be quite small, less than a 1% increase, especially for average users. Customers who use large amounts of water (more than 25,000 gallons/month) are likely to see an increase in their bill, especially during the summer months.
